# Pipeline Cybersecurity Jurisdiction

- Five Congressional Committees have jurisdiction over pipeline cybersecurity
  - House Homeland Security
  - House Energy & Commerce
  - Senate Energy & Natural Resources
  - Senate Commerce, Science, & Transportation
  - Senate Environment & Public Works
- Both DHS and DOE regulate pipelines, but only DHS (through TSA) can set cybersecurity standards



# Bill Formerly Known as EFA Passes Senate

- Vote 68-32
  - Republican vote: 19 - 31
  - Democratic vote: 49 - 1
- Total spending: \$250 Billion
- Key provisions:
  - \$4.35 billion new NSF tech directorate research
  - \$52 billion for semiconductors (CHIPS Act)
  - \$26 billion for technology transfer
- Other provisions include academic security measures, Anti-China

# Tech Transfer Provisions Remain

- \$9.425 billion to the Regional Technology Hub Program
- \$575 million to the Regional Technology Strategy Grant program
- \$2.41 billion for the Manufacturing USA program
- \$4.06 billion for academic tech transfer programs
- \$2.9 billion for technology test beds

# Evolution of EFA

- Passed Senate

## R&D Spending Boom

Legislation currently in the Senate would appropriate about \$190 billion to strengthen domestic technology. Main spending areas include:

# Behind the Scenes

- House Science Committee is moving a simpler NSF reauthorization bill
- Sen. Schumer is setting up his bill for conference committee
- Schumer's Priority is the new Technology Directorate
  - Easier to fund existing programs than new ones
  - First establish the program, then raise its budget
- Risks:
  - House/Senate split
  - Too much baggage



# Florida & New York Pass Anti-Tech Legislation

- New York:
  - Focus on monopolistic behavior
  - Approval needed for mergers
  - Tighter definition of Dominance
  - Passed Senate, Pending in House
- Florida
  - Focus on censorship
  - Private and official right of action
  - Accounts may only be suspended for 14 days
  - No deplatforming political candidates
  - (Disney exempted)



# 100 Day Reviews are Done

- Supply-Chain review of computer chips, advanced batteries, critical minerals, and pharmaceuticals
- Yes, there are supply chain issues
- Administration now moves to enact new rules
  - Plan to diversify the supply of rare earth minerals
  - Task force to address supply chain disruptions in “semiconductors, home building and construction, transportation and agriculture, and food”
  - Supply chain “Strike Force” to combat unfair trade practices
  - Develop 10 year plan and release \$17 billion to promote battery production and recycling
- Year-long reviews of defense, public health, information technology, transportation, energy and food production due in February



# PRO Act

- 47 Democratic Cosponsors
  - Sens. Kelly, Sinema, & Warner have not cosponsored
  - Sen. Schumer has promised a vote if it gets 50 cosponsors
- Discussions with Senate sponsors suggest little interest in amending the bill
- May be added to infrastructure or other legislation
  
- Passed as written, the bill would prohibit most independent technology consulting un the U.S.

# National Artificial Intelligence Initiative

- Created by National AI Initiative Act of 2020
- Clearing house of information on government AI
- Coordinate AI projects and research across agencies
- Recommend AI policy to Administration and Congress
- Lead by OSTP
