## Technical Activities Coordinator

- TA will send out an email to all section officers around second week of September to see if they need any help with anything for their chapters.
- TA will also send instructions on how to find numbers on potential new chapter formation.
- TA will host a meeting for Region 3 Technical Activities discussion during October.
- Future-plans: TA is exploring a competition for all sections in R3 to generate interest in formation of new chapters and effective operation of the existing ones. ## R3 SSC Web Site

- R3 SSC Knowledgebase is under construction: <https://kb.ieee.org/r3/>
- Developer of the MineraKB Knowledgebase Plugin is located in the Ukraine and will not be able to provide any product support until the war ends.
- It appears that as you add KB topics, the plugin pushes some of the topics out of the list of ones that get displayed. Working on a fix.
- Working through a technical problem where FAQs get lost in the creation of new FAQs. Considering a work-around to use BLOGs for sensitive items and FAQ for persistent items.

## Projects Committee

- In early July, Sonya Dillard sent all R3 Section Chairs the announcement about the funding opportunity for Climate Change projects.
- So far, I have received one inquiry from the Chair of the Columbia Section about the funding limits and one inquiry from the Vice Chair of the Orlando Section regarding whether Senior Design groups are eligible to participate. (The answer to the second question is “Yes” provided that they meet the other requirements such as the participation of at least three IEEE members of any grade level.)
- SSC Knowledgebase technical limitations are preventing posting of the Projects Committee Climate change Project flyer. Currently exploring other locations to advertise this activity.

  - Resolved issue with disappearing Read / Unread status icons that required hovering the mouse pointer to check status. Now they are permanently displayed
  - Resolved issue with being only able to display 20 messages in the message screen. Now a complete history is listed of read and unread messages
  - Identified and resolved disappearing Menu Bar issue with changing browser zoom settings
