Team,

This month I presented as part of an IEEE-USA <u>consulting workshop</u> at the <u>IM</u> <u>Engineering South conference</u> in Charlotte, and I continue my work on the MGA GUOS and the IEEE Governance Committees.

The big news is that Region 3 members, Grayson Randall and Bill Guzek, drove the MOVE-1 Truck to Ruidoso, New Mexico where they are working with the Red Cross to assist the victims of the South Fork & Salt Fires. As of June 24th, two deaths have been reported as a result of the blazes and approximately 1,400 structures have been destroyed. Residents began returning to Ruidoso Monday, June 24. Re-entry will be for local full-time residents only, and they are being asked to return with a week's worth of food and water as local grocery stores remain closed. Residents are likely to return to homes still lacking electricity, gas, and water. You can receive updates on the deployment on Facebook
