



Elections Process & Resources/Links



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- Effective 17 February 2024 all Sections, Chapters, Affinity Groups and Student Branches are to hold their elections in compliance with the updated simplified process for Geographic Unit Elections
- All Sections are to utilize the Nominations Tool to run their elections
- An orderly and regular turnover of officers should be a routine feature of IEEE volunteerism to ensure a healthy flow of new ideas and invigoration of geographic units.
- All elections must be conducted with the utmost integrity. The responsibility of maintaining fair and transparent election practices falls upon the candidates, the organizational units conducting the elections, officers, staff, volunteers, and all committees involved in managing and overseeing the election process.



Sample Timeline for Annual Elections Process

A sample timeline is included below for reference. Please note, certain steps have required time frames such as the call for nominations and voting, while the petition process has a recommended timeframe. The remainder of the steps provide an average amount of time that it may take a Geographic Unit to complete for planning purposes only. Resulting in minimum time for an election to be completed from 6 months down to 4 months.

MGA is pleased to launch a simplified Geographic Unit election process effective 17 February 2024 to Sections, Chapters, Affinity Groups and Student Branches. On this page you can find various tools, resources and frequently asked questions to assist Geographic Unit leaders in executing a successful election that is in compliance with the MGA Operations Manual.

To familiarize yourself with the new process please review the MGA Operations Manual, Section 9.13 Geographic Unit Elections. Training sessions will be scheduled for unit officers throughout 2024. Below you can find an overview of the geographic unit election process key updates.
