Our members in the Region are still trying to recover from the aftermath of the Helene & Milton and we wish them a speedy recovery as they put their lives together. Apparently, there are some areas within the affected area that still don't have any clean running water or electricity.

As indicated before, I personally would like to keep our effected members and their families in our prayers as they are in the process of rebuilding their lives, and would also like to extend my thanks to each and every one of our dedicated MOVE volunteers that actively supported the disaster. MOVE-3 is on its way back to Region 6 and MOVE-1 & MOVE-2 are undergoing maintenance in preparation for upcoming STEM events and potential support for any unforeseen disasters.

During the month, I have been engaging with various Section nomination committees as they are actively working on section elections. I have and continue to identify potential new individuals that would be interested in serving in a leadership role as we need to actively identify, engage, and promote new individuals among us with the energy and drive to extend our region's successes.
