Dear Colleagues,

Happy New Year to all. Hope you all had a great Holiday celebration with family and friends and are now fully engaged and ready for the busy activities in 2025! Since our last ExCom meeting, the Region has been active on many fronts. Early in December Region 3 hosted the Innovation, Workforce, and Research Conference (IWRC) that brought together stakeholders from industry, government, and academia in Huntsville, Alabama, to meet, learn, and discuss the CHIPS Act and other government programs that promote innovation and small business in the southeast. In advance of IWRC, the event included a DoD roundtable, bringing together DoD and local industry leaders in conversations on how to work with DoD. We also held the Region's strategic planning meeting in December at the same site of SoutheastCon 2025,

establishing our goals for 2025. The theme for 2025 is "Engaging New Leadership" as the intent is to work with our students and YP in 2025 and get them involved with local section and regional capacities. The intent is to help sections with identifying and recruiting new members into new leadership roles.

The year started with the release of IEEE's 2025-2030, IEEE Strategic Plan, introducing six new goals that reinforce the IEEE mission to advance technology for the benefit of humanity. The plan was developed through extensive community input, including stakeholder interviews, global focus groups, and a survey of more than 35,000 individuals.

Also, Region 6's Rising Stars which included participation of YP's from many IEEE Regions, including great representation by Region 3, re-enforced the need to expand interaction with students and YPs. This was the 11th anniversary of Rising Stars and it was filled with energy by students and YP from several IEEE Regions, with over 350 participants which far exceeded Region 6 organizers' expectations. Other regions, particularly Region 1, 2, and 9 are looking at establishing a similar events, and Region 3 needs to evaluate if we need to incorporate such an as part of SoutheastCon or evaluate other options. Region 1 + 2 are potentially interested in joining Region 3 and creating a Rising Stars — East, if a separate event, or combining it with SoutheastCon.

President & CEO of IEEE, Kathleen Kramer, is very much concentrating her efforts toward engagement at various level, particularly, with students and YP, as several students from various regions, including Region 3, were invited to the retreat and were included as part of a panel discussion. The retreat also included moderation by McKinley with various topics and exercises geared toward enhancing IEEE's strategy moving forward.

January 2025 is still not over yet, and we have plenty of new activities to tackle. Next IEEE BoD Series is scheduled for mid-February, and of course, our premier event, SoutheastCon 2025 is shaping up to be a great event at the end of March. The hosting committee is actively busy to welcome everyone to Charlotte, Concord to be exact!
