Why Should I Become More Involved?

When the time is right...

- Expand your network, e.g., <u>Collabratec</u>, <u>Conferences</u>
- Increase your technical knowledge, e.g., <u>IEEE</u> Learning Network
- Make an impact
 - Get involved in Humanitarian Technologies programs
 - Influence the next generation through <u>STEM</u>
 - Mentor others or seek a mentor
 - Contribute to development of <u>Standards</u>
- Get leadership experience for your resume / performance review, e.g., <u>Center for Leadership</u> <u>Excellence</u>

Depends on your interests


- Serve on committees can evolve into Elected and Appointed leadership roles



How Can I Become More Involved as a Volunteer?

Take the first step

- Talk to those on the previous slide, or others with broad IEEE experience
- Review charters, Ops Manuals, committee descriptions, position information
 - IEEE Committee descriptions
 - MGA Committees
 - TAB Committees
 - EAB committees
- Nominate yourself or ask someone to nominate you use "Nominations & Appointments" drop-down list
- Go to a meeting; talk with those involved
- Contact leaders of groups you are interested in
- Check out the <u>Volunteer Portal</u>



The key is to let someone know that you are interested and want to help

How Can I Become More Involved as a Volunteer?

Work Your Way Up Student Branch Officer Work your way up, gaining relevant experience. Directly Section Committee Member address the specific position in your nomination package. Section Committee Chair Section Officer **Section Chair** Region committee member Region Rep to MGA committee Region committee Chair **Region Officer** MGA committee member **Region Director** MGA committee chair IEEE Board, Committees, other, ... How Can I Become More Involved as a Volunteer?

Write a GREAT Nomination Package

- Directly address the specific position in your nomination package
- DO NOT use the same submission for different positions
- Read about the position; think about what is required for the position and the charter/goals of the committee or group
- List relevant experience within IEEE <u>and</u> elsewhere
- Identify things you achieved in previous positions
- What would you want to achieve in this position?
- Create your nomination packages offline (so you can save them and share them)
- Ask someone to review your responses before you submit

Where Can I Be Involved?

Many options!

- Locally e.g., a Society's conference near you
- Regionally Be a Region 3 volunteer; plus often Societies and other IEEE groups have Region positions
- USA Especially if you are interested in Policy!
- World-wide Humanitarian outreach, conferences, Committee and Board meetings

For higher level positions, consider the time commitment, including meeting preparation and travel, before submitting your nomination



When Can I Get Started?

Today!

- For many positions, it takes time
- The earlier you start putting your name out there, the better
- Ask questions all along the way
- You can begin a long-term plan for where you want to be in the future – create a roadmap
- Start today!
