
Subgroup 3, Engagement and Membership

Funding: This project was funded by a Seed Grant of US \$40,000 in 2023.

- Scope: As the ways people connect change, their engagement with IEEE and the nature of membership will likely evolve to something different than the current connections IEEE and our Societies make with members and others now. The sub-group has reviewed past membership trends and been briefed by experts on IEEE and society membership trends.
- Key Themes and Considerations
 - Wants/needs of Students and Young Professionals
 - New audiences (fields, technicians, population shifts)
 - Skills training and development needs
 - Understanding communication preferences
 - Impact of AI
 - How to organize to engage in an impactful way

Core staff team on this project includes Marc Beebe, Jamie Moesch, with volunteer direction from Jill Gostin and Roger Fujii. Kuangyunn Chiu, Michael Kreisberg, and Cecelia Jankoswki provided additional support and insight.

- Activity: The subgroup initiated a hybrid study of young professionals working in industry to determine sources of support they receive for their technical and career needs, identify challenges they see coming in their field, understand how IEEE might support them.
- Next Steps: The subgroup is working with Member and Geographic Activities, connecting with the Catalyst group to share findings and discuss potential partnerships

Innovation, Workforce, and Research Conference in Region 3

- In July 2022, Congress passed the CHIPS Act of 2022 to strengthen domestic semiconductor
 manufacturing, design and research, fortify the economy and national security, and reinforce America's
 chip supply chains.
- This IWRC conference is a unique opportunity to bring together leading experts from the semiconductor, aerospace, and defense industries, along with key policymakers, to explore the exciting developments stemming from the CHIPS Act and other federal legislation.









CaribCon 2026?

- Engage Conference Committee to start planning for a Caribbean Conference that includes a joint support by Region 3 and Region 9
- MOU in signature mode
- A rotating annual conference among Caribbean Nations in Region 3 and Region 9
 - Provide additional means for Jamaica & South FL to represent Region 3
 - Conference to return to alternate between Region 3 & 9
 - A technical conference concentrating on the technical focus areas and needs of Caribbean nations
