### TOUR AT 5PM





- CFP out to EDAS broadcast twice
- CFP out to R3 second blast next week
- Deadline Jan 15
- Reviewers: 213 currently accepted, 165 no answer, 10 declined
- 31 papers so far
  - 13 accepted (all with at least 3 reviews!)
  - 4 rejected
  - 4 withdrawn
  - Bulk of papers expected Dec 15-Jan 15

### Industry Days – All-day Thursday, Half-day Friday (per available)

#### SEPARATE Co-Located EVENT

- Format is established: Four Tracks:
- *Robotics* including autonomous vehicles, manufacturing, and STEM robotics
- Internet of Things (IoT) including security, applications, edge processing and ML, and protocols
- Hardware Design including components, PCB and DFM, FPGA, and chip design/manufacturing (CHIPS Act)
- **Software Design** including programming good practices, abstraction, operating systems including RTOS, memory management, security



### **Industry Day Sessions**

- Low-cost (\$99/149)
- No Meals (or optional)
- Speakers are fed but are free (may attend SoutheastCon?) must be non-commercial BUT sponsors may put on commercial sessions (see Patron sheet)
- Totally marketed to INDUTRY MEMBERS R3, possibly R2 and R5 (via IEEE-USA)
- Application papers minimal theoretical or research (things they can take to office and excel)
- Discussions with potential attendees and vendors at other shows have been very positive
- Recruiting track chairs for the 4 tracks
- Call for speakers out by end of December
- Should help pull in industry patrons / exhibitors that don't normally consider SoutheastCon



#### HOW R3 CAN HELP

- Many of you know subject matter experts in these areas track chairs or presenters!
- Many of you know vendors that would like to reach out to industry engineers
- Our leadership has the industry connections to make this happen
- I am leading this but need people to take pieces of this:
  - Locating speakers, track organizers
  - Locating potential exhibitors / sponsors across R3 and beyond
  - Getting the word out to potential attendees
