### **Format**

Prepare your extended abstract and your final paper with the standard IEEE Power and Energy Society format as shown in the sample paper in PDF available in the webpage of "Author Instructions", with formatting instructions as the content "Preparation of a Formatted Technical Work for the IEEE Power Engineering Society."

## Compliant IEEE Xplore .pdf (required)

Convert your document to *IEEE Xplore compliant* Adobe .pdf format. To do this, follow the link to IEEE PDF eXpress from the EPEC 2009 website http://www.ieee.ca/epec09 or use the following link:

Documents in other format will be not be accepted.

## Submission

Submit your *Extended Abstract compliant .pdf document online* by using the EIDOS Paper Management System. Deadline for submitting extended abstract is **JULY 6, 2009**.

You will receive a confirmation e-mail shortly.

Once you receive the Notice of Paper Acceptance, submit your *Final Paper compliant .pdf document* by using the EIDOS Paper Management System. Deadline for submitting final paper is **SEPTEMBER 7, 2009**. You will receive a confirmation e-mail shortly.

#### NOTF:

- Extended abstract minimum length should be 2500 words, minimum 3 pages in IEEE PES format: body text font size 10, single-spaced, double-column format, on 8.5×11 inch letter size paper.
- Final paper length is 6 pages, maximum 8 and for every page over 6 there will be an extra page charge.
- Submission of maximum 2 papers per one author/coauthor is allowed. The submitted extended abstracts will go through a peer review.
- The final version of accepted paper will be included in the EPEC2009 conference digest and published in IEEE Xplore.

# Registration (required)

IEEE policy requires that at least one author must register at the full conference rate prior to submitting the final paper (by September 12, 2007). A registered author may present up to two papers at the conference.
