On the occasion of IEEE day and Gandhi Jayanthi on 02nd October 2018, the IEEE MVSr Student Branch has visited the Phin School (School for Deaf and Dumb).

The children were so excited and expressed their joy with their smile and their sparkling eyes as the coordinators greeted them. They were so welcoming and eager to receive the coordinators as if they were meeting their friends or cousins.



The children couldn't hear and speak but they could communicate through signs by their staff members. The event started with the coordinators interacting with the staff and let the students know about the purpose of our visit .

At the beginning we coordinators faced difficulty in interacting with the children but soon it turned out easy.



The event continued by conducting games(Frog Jump, Musical Chairs) for the kids.

Frog jump was conducted to boys (7-12 yrs) where they played with all their energy and the zeal of winning a competition. As the children cannot hear , a cloth was utilized as a signal to start where the students had to concentrate by looking at the signal and start the game quickly.

Musical chairs was conducted to girls (5-10yrs) where a person in the middle would rotate a cloth and when the cloth is put down, they are allowed to stop running and sit in the chair.



The reflexes of the kids were so quick which was clearly show cased in these games. We distributed gifts for children who won in the competition.



To our surprise the kids are extremely sportive and they are strong enough to overcome their disability and indeed throw life a challenge with a wide spread smile on their face. This is a very good example for the phrase “Disability is a matter of perception”. The kids are not disabled any more.

Roosevelt states “Believe you can, and you’re halfway done” and the kids are half way done already. They are the living demonstration for the respect one should have towards life and improving one’s strengths to overcome their weakness.



It was time for us to leave, we distributed fruits to the children. All that we could take back is their love and self-satisfaction along with a lot of happiness. As a young generation we have to help people as our privilege rather than a duty.
