

EMBS 2003 Poster Competition Rules

1. The poster must be of scientific nature. It can be research or practical experience oriented, but must be relevant to the practices of Engineering, Medicine or Biology or any subset thereof. If you have any questions as to the relevance of your topic, please contact us.
2. The poster can be no larger than 42"x60" (1.0068m x 1.524m). It can be mechanically produced or hand drawn.
3. The poster can have as many colours as the presenter wishes
4. The poster **MUST** include the EMBS logo on it, as shown below.



5. The poster **MUST** include the IEEE logo on it, an example of which is below.



6. Table space will not be available, so working models, breadboards, etc. should not be brought along.
7. The poster must be in English.
8. The poster must be clearly legible from a distance of 1m, with font being large enough to read (i.e. 14-18 point).
9. An introduction to your topic must be located on the upper right side of the poster, and conclusion(s) on the lower left hand side. Both must be clearly marked.
10. Posters must be horizontally orientated.

Judging will be based on:

1. The quality of the work, both theoretical and practical
2. The quality of the presentation, both written and oral.
