1. Executive Leadership Council

Paul Gartz has formed an Executive Leadership Council, consisting of:

Subunits of this council have met three times during 2005. Purpose is to perform stratecig planning and take up such items that require resolution between Board meetings. This will also provide continuity of activities between administrations.

2. Industry Relations (IR) (IEEE BoD) Ad Hoc Committee

Cleon Anderson, 2005 IEEE President, has appointed me to chair the 2005 IR Committee. Of importance is the fact that IEEE and Boeing have signed an MOU to work together on areas of mutual interest. IEEE and AESS mirror each other in the industry and society worlds. This should prove to be a healthy alliance. Another company, Areva, has also signed an MOU with IEEE. Agilent Technologies is in negotiations with IEEE also. Other corporations are being contacted (GE, for example).

The first semi-annual get together between boeing and the IEEE is scheduled for 6, 7 October in Seattle. I hope to give a verbal update at the BoG meeting. Now here is the interesting aspect of this boeing/IEEE alliance:

3. Chapters Summit

4. Sections Congress

Sections Congress is a RAB supported activity that is scheduled on three year intervals. It is a chance for a Section Representative from each Section to convene, share experiences, get some IEEE training and define items that need attention by IEEE Boards. These action items are defined and voted on to provide priority of implementation. This prioritized list is then presented to the IEEE Boards for implementation. Many of our AESS Chapter Chairs attended the Sections Congress (which adjourned at noon Monday) after the AESS Chapters Summit. Ron Ogan, Bob Scolli and Jim Leonard chaired a Panel discussion at sections Congress regarding Rejuvination of Sections and Chapters

5. Lagging items

a. Rejuvination of the UMR AESS Student Chapter

Jag (UMR IEEE Student Branch Councilor) is very busy this year and put effort into this project in the Spring of 2006. On Sept 26, I again talked to Jag to encourage him to move up his effort in this area. He is busy now setting up an embedded computer center, but that may gell sooner than expected. I will follow up this fall. Jag has identified an advisor, Dr. Balakrishnan (UMR Aerospace Engineering Department) and possibly 23-26 students that migh join AESS to get this chapter active-Stay Tuned!

b. AESS GOLD Nominee

Dan Berg, my nominee for the AESS GOLD Chair, has become very involved with the sale of a Boeing fighter aircraft to an international customer. As a result He could not spend time on this project-essentially he was out of the country. We have 240 GOLD members in AESS. This action will pick up after the first of the year and Dan will provide some local assistance. GOLD stands for Graduates of the Last Decade.

c. Special Task Force at UMR

Prof Keith Stanek, past ECE Dept Chair and now retired, has experienced a medical problem. He is undergoing a medical procedure now-hopefully only one. When he gets back on his feet, I will follow up on this and get it rolling. I just received an email (27 Sept) from Dr. Stanek. He had a pacemaker implanted and is back on his feet. I plan to meet with him within the next month.

6. What's Next? Some thoughts on 2006 and beyond

a. BoG Officers

I am requesting all officers to remain in their current positions with the exception that Jim Howard will take over as VP Members. I thank you all for all the volunteer accomplishments!

b. Chapters Summit

I would request that Charles Gager determine if would could allocate \$30K/year So that we can hold another Chapters Summit coincident with the next Sections Congress (2008 in Ottawa, Canada). I note that each of the IEEE Regions set aside yearly funding for Sections Congress.

c. Resources for International Activities

I congratulate Paul Gartz on initiating tremendous international activity in 2005. The fact that He worked with the Aerospace conference to bring it in compliance with IEEE requirements resulted in a windfall of funding. In 2006, we will not have this windfall, but I hope to continue with this international initiative. Hopefully we can get international corporations to help support volunteer travel from outside the USA. And, I believe we will plan for a BoG meeting in 2007 in the UK in conjunction with the RADAR conference to be held there.
